The Florida Conservation Corps is a program available through Volunteer Florida with support from Americorps. They have partnered to bring two Americorps volunteers to Birch Park for a year of service which began February 15. The volunteers will work on Project A.N.T. (Americorps Non-Native plant Terminators) to eradicate exotic plants in the Park. State parks are nature parks. Their goal is to preserve the natural flora of Florida so future generations can experience the "Real Florida". Each volunteer will spend 1700 hours/11 months working in our Park on natural resource management. Activities can also include prescribed fires, and disaster recovery.

Americorps volunteers gain leadership skills and on-the-job-training as well as a living stipend and an education award that can help pay for college or repay student loans.
